

His research revolves around ensuring global consumer satisfaction of Australian red meat covering all aspects of red meat supply-chains focusing on critical control points which affect the eating quality of meat from genetics, to on-farm management, processing, tech to measure meat traits through to the consumer.

Roger Evans is the Co-Principal of Nagol Park Shorthorn Stud at Tamworth in Northern New South Wales. He has bred and exhibited several Grand Champions at the Sydney Royal Easter Show, numerous division winners at the Dubbo National Shorthorn Show & Sale, including the Grand Champion bull in 2008.

Roger is also director of Bovine Scanning Services Pty Ltd and an accredited ultrasound scanner for all carcase traits, as well as a Beef Class Structural Assessor. He scans over 19,000 head of cattle per annum and conducts structural assessments on more than 2000 head each year.

Roger holds a Bachelor of Rural Science with Honours, from the University of New England, specialising in extensive animal production and meat science and technology. Whilst completing his degree, Roger represented Australia at the Inter-collegiate Meat Judging Competition in the USA.



#### Author of best selling book "Head Over Heels"



Sam Bailey is a farmer, pilot, husband and best-selling author – all from a wheelchair. With his down-to-earth, laconic style, he takes audiences on a powerful journey from his childhood in the Australian bush, through a life-changing car accident, to achieving his dreams through grit, humour and determination.

Defying the odds, Sam taught himself to ride a four-wheel bike, created a hoist to access farm machinery and learned to fly an ultralight aircraft. He also found love with former ABC Rural Reporter Jenny Black, proposing to her live on regional radio. Their story featured on ABC's Australian Story in 2000 and was later shared in their 2006 book Head Over Heels.

After 24 years running a mixed farm near Croppa Creek, Sam and Jenny now live near Tamworth, travelling Australia to inspire others. They're also working toward their next big goal, Helifirst, where Sam aims to become the world's first quadriplegic helicopter pilot, flying into schools to encourage kids to chase their dreams.
